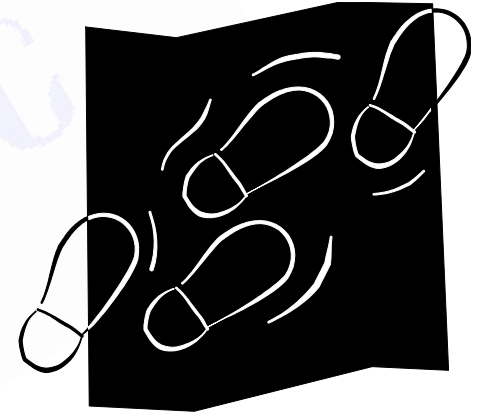

Assessment

Assessments help determine the nature of the problem and/or the involvement with mood-altering substances and its effect on the lives of the individuals and family members.

Individual Counseling

Counselors work with youth to help them identify problems and develop strategies to help them resolve issues that cause or contribute to the strain and disruption of their lives.

Group Counseling

Youth groups meet with a counselor as group members help each other identify and resolve the problems they are experiencing.

AOC Support

Pathways, through the Mental Health Alcohol and Drug Recovery Board of Putnam County, is a major funding source for the Alternative Opportunity Center. Students from all nine school districts benefit from this program. In addition to financial support, Pathways clinicians offer onsite counseling and prevention activities at the AOC

Prevention Education

Presentations and groups are available to individuals, schools, and community groups.

Suicide Prevention Coalition and Depression Recognition.

Pathways is coordinating the Putnam County Coalition to reduce suicide among the youth. Educators, law enforcement, ministers and health care workers have been in-serviced in recognizing depression, a major cause of youth suicide.

Adolescent Anger Management Group

These sessions are designed to deal with the impact of anger management on the individual, family and society.

Diversion

This program educates adolescents and young adults regarding the health, impairment and legal problems that may result from the use of alcohol.

Pathways Counseling Center, Inc.

The goal of our agency is to provide services for Putnam County residents and surrounding areas who are experiencing difficulties in day to day living. We provide referral and information, assessment, treatment, education, consultation, support and guidance depending on the nature of the problem and its severity. Services are available to children, adolescents, and adults within Individual, group, or family settings.

Our professional staff members are experienced and knowledgeable in their respective disciplines and are credentialed as required by the State of Ohio.

WrapAround Services

WrapAround (Wrap) Services provide coordination of services for children in danger of "out of home placement". The Wrap Team consists of all parties supplying services, family members, school representatives and juvenile authorities. The goal is to provide the support necessary to keep families together.

Psychiatric Services

Psychiatric evaluations are provided by the physician. Medication education and monitoring are provided as needed.

Community Support Services

Support services are available to assist clients with linkages to necessary services to facilitate treatment.

Mental Health Education

The staff offers programs such as educational presentations and support groups. These programs are available to individuals and organizations.

Putnam Adolescent Response Team for Youth (P.A.R.T.Y.)

This program offers youth a substance free environment for developing leadership skills, cooperative learning and socialization. Open to all high school students.

Socialization Skill Building

Children learn methods and skills for improving relationships with peers. Skills include: managing bullies and teasing, developing self-esteem, managing peer pressure, developing listening and communication skills, developing problem solving skills, good sportsmanship and cooperation, and making good choices and decisions.
